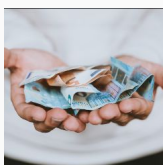




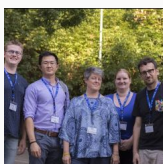

Researchers Call on National Governments in Europe to Protect EU Investments in Education, Research and Innovation



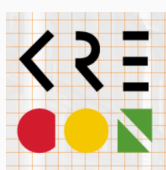
The European Council of Doctoral Candidates and Junior Researchers (Eurodoc), the Marie Curie Alumni Association (MCAA), and the Young Academy of Europe (YAE) reaffirm [their position](#) that education, research and innovation in Europe must be strongly supported. As signatories and active supporters of the [#EUInvestInKnowledge](#) campaign, Eurodoc, MCAA and YAE call on governments, institutions and leaders across Europe to strengthen investment at European level and urge them to raise the budget of the next EU framework programme for R&I (2021-2027), Horizon Europe, to at least €120 billion. 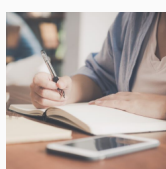
Eurodoc Alumnus, Former Ukraine Delegate Yuliia Ovchynnykova Was Elected to the Ukrainian Parliament

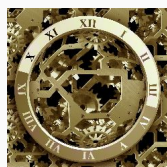
Eurodoc Wishes a Successful Mandate to Mariya Gabriel, the Commissioner- designate for "Innovation and Youth"

Research Fellowships in Poland: Call for Applications



The Polish Institute of Advanced Studies (PIASt) invites applications for 5- or 10-month research fellowships starting their research stay from October 2020. The 4 fellowships are offered to early career researchers who have obtained their doctoral degree in the last 10 years and have at least 3 years of research experience in the fields of the humanities and social sciences. Travel Grants for Early Career Researchers to Attend ESOF2020



Open calls for travel grants to attend the EuroScience Open Forum 2020 ([ESOF2020](#)), the largest general science meeting in Europe, held in Trieste, Italy from 5-9 July 2020.

The grants are offered for excellent early career researchers based in [Sweden](#), irrespective of their nationality and also Swedish nationals studying or working in any European country; [Luxembourg](#): travel grants to excellent young researchers (PhD or postdoc), either based in Luxembourg or funded by the FNR abroad, irrespective of their nationality. In Switzerland, travel grants are offered PhD candidates

and early postdocs from the [University of Zurich](#). Check your eligibility and register now.
