OECD Report on Reducing the Precarity of **Academic Research Careers**



There is an urgent need for systemic change in the way research careers are structured and supported. The Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) published a report detailing the

challenges researchers face, with particular focus on fixed-term postdoctoral researcher positions with no security. The report, which Eurodoc contributed to, outlines a potential framework for policies and practices geared towards attracting and retaining more diverse talent and improving the quality of science. All Publishers Must Provide Researchers with **Clarity and Transparency on Open Access**



European University Association (EUA), CESAER, and Science Europe released a joint statement calling for an end to the restrictions and embargoes attached to journal articles and urginged academic publishers to respect researchers' rights. Contrary to the principles of Open Access, publishers commonly require researchers to sign-off publishing rights and restrict the dissemination of their findings. The joint statement takes a strong stance against this system and urges adaptation to a more open model for the benefit of society. Read more here.

The Role of Academic Institutions in Building **Resilient and Sustainable Societies**



The League of European Research Universities (LERU) released a statement on the role of research-intensive universities in creating societies that are resilient and sustainable in the face of challenges. The statement, penned and signed by LERU rectors, underlines key

potential contributions through research, education, and in shaping public policy. LERU rectors also renewed their commitment "to confront current and yet-to-develop challenges at the European and global stage in the coming years". Read the statement here.
